

Freedom House Male Halfway House

Admission Criteria

- 1. Freedom House provides long-term treatment in a halfway house setting. Therefore the need for further treatment is the first requirement for admission.
- 2. Freedom House requires a willingness on the part of the referral to commit to long-term treatment (approximately nine months).
- 3. Freedom House requires the referral to be a minimum of at least 18 years of age and not attending high school.
- 4. Freedom House requires referrals to secure and maintain full time employment during their stay. Therefore, referrals must be ready, willing, and able to work.
- 5. Freedom House requires referrals to secure PPD testing, physical exams, and other medical testing and/or exams that may be added as a result of the pre-admission screening interview prior to admission.
- 6. Freedom House evaluates referrals who are on drug therapy to stabilize moods or behavior on a case-by-case basis.
- 7. Freedom House requires referrals to pay for their entire medical and other health needs during their stay.
- 8. Freedom House does not accept referrals that have on-going medical problems that will detract from the referrals' ability to participate fully in the program.
- 9. Freedom House requires referrals to submit to a telephone screen interview, and whatever conditions may be placed upon acceptance.
- 10. Freedom House does not accept persons convicted of certain crimes including certain violent offenses, arson, and sex offenses (other than Tier 1, which may be accepted).
- 11. Freedom House requires referrals to cut their hair short and be clean shaven.
- 12. Freedom house referrals must meet level 3.1, under the ASAM placement criteria.
